2. Voted, to defend the suits commenced by the inhabitants of Livermore against the inhabitants of Standish for the support of Beetham School. (Chose Samuel Spring Agent to defend the Town in said suit.) Voted, that the Agent may refer or settle with the inhabitants of Livermore on equitable terms if he should find it for the interest of the town.

Voted, to dissolve this meeting.

8. To make such alterations in School Districts & make such new School Districts.

9. To raise money to expend on Highways.

10. To fix the price of Labor in the Highways.

11. To open or discontinue such Roads as the Town see fit.

12. To abate such Taxes as the Town see fit.

13. To restrain Cattle & Horses from running at large within such limits as the Town think proper.

14. To direct the Constable in notifying Jury meetings in future.

15. To give such directions as the Town think proper in taking the valuation

& making the assessments the ensuing year.

16. To vote the Town Treasurers fees for the past year.

17. To vote the Collectors fees for the past year.

18. To provide for the support of the Poor.

The selectmen give notice that they shall be in session at the School-house in District No. 10 on Monday the sixth day of March next, from ten to eleven O'Clock in the forenoon to add such to their list of voters as may have been omitted in making & correcting the same.

Voted, that the several school Districts in this town be authorized to choose the District Agent or Agents in district meeting lawfully assembled.

6. Voted to raise six hundred dollars in addition to the interest of the School fund for the support of schools the ensuing year.

9. Voted to raise two thousand & five hundred dollars to be expended in making & repairing Highways the ensuing year. 10. Voted that the price of Lumber be the same as the price of Lumber in the same place.

13. Voted that Cattle & Horses be restrained from going at large within the limits of this town the ensuing year if not under the care of a keeper.

14. Voted that notifications of meetings for the drafts and selection of jurors in future shall be by the Constables, giving notice to the selectmen or the mayor of them, and the Town Clerk.

15. Voted that the Assessors of this town shall give reasonable warning to the inhabitants, by posting up notifications in some public place or places in said town, to make and bring in to them, true and perfect lists of their polls, and of all their taxable estates.

16. Voted to allow the Treasurer for his fees the first year five dollars.

17. Voted to allow the Collector for his fees the first year, for collecting 400.3 m. m. d. d. to adjourn this meeting to the third Monday next at one o'clock P. M.

Monday March 20th The said inhabitants met according to adjournment.

Art. 2. Voted to allow the following accounts, to wit:

3. Chose Loris Higgins Surveyor of Highways. sworn April 5th before John Clark.

5. Voted to raise seven hundred dollars to defray town charges.

8. Voted that Daniel Foreman with his family & estate be taken from school District No. 12 & annexed to District No. 6.

12. Voted the following abatements of taxes in Edward Thompsons Bills, to wit:

Hugh M. Smith for 1823-4. Wm. Motley for 1823. Oliver Hall for 1823.

4. Voted to accept the report of the Trustees of the School fund. (see on file.)

11. Voted that the town approve & allow the following described town Roads laid out by the selectmen & Report made this day, to wit:

1st. A Road beginning on the County road at the bridge over the river in said town of Standish & running North 42 degs. West 37 rods to the mill privilege at the head of the Solarad. said road to be four rods wide - two rods on each side of the line: & damages to the owner of the land \$5.00.

2nd. A road beginning at the County road opposite Mr. James Davis house thence running North 45 degrees west in the town road leading to Oak Hill 28 rods to the south side line of the hundred acre lot No. 65 in the 2 division thence North 50 degrees West on said lot 34 rods to a stake thence North 78 degrees West 92 rods on said lot to the old County road. said road to be four rods wide two rods on each side of the line. Damages to the owners of the land five dollars.

Voted, to dissolve this meeting.

4. Voted, To allow William Spear's Act. for making a Gleave Forty five dollars \$45.  
5. Voted, To allow the soldiers belonging to this town in doing military duty at the next reviews of the Militia thirty cents each, in addition to the sum allowed by law.  
6. Voted, To build a house to keep the Gleave in, in the burying yard near the Meeting-house - Voted, That Samuel Bennett, Thomas Gann & Daniel Greenman be a Committee to build a suitable house to keep said Gleave in.

7. Voted, That the Town approve and allow the following described Town Roads as laid out and reported by the Selectmen, to wit:

A road from the most Westerly corner of the 100 acre Lot No 88- 3rd Division - thence North 44 Degs West 100 rods on a plain road to John Sands'.

A road beginning at the termination of a town road at the North East end of the Dole lot No 22 - 2nd Division - thence South 45 Degs East 25 rods to the North side line of Joshua Littlefields farm, at the West corner thereof - said Road to be 4 rods wide viz: 2 rods on each side of the line - Damages allowed to Joseph Smith - 3 dollars - To Daniel Dole Hays 3 dollars.

Voted, To dissolve this Meeting.
