Voted to pass the eighth Article, article entitled the adjournment

Voted to Receive the sum of Eight Hundred & Ten Dollars for the support of Schools

Voted to Raise Three thousand Dollars to make and repair the Highways

Voted that the price of Labour on the Highways be the same as last year

Voted to disburse the disburse the eleventh article

Voted that the Agent of Joseph Walker & others for a Road be paid on the 1st

Voted to accept the following road laid out by the Selectmen - viz - Beginning at Laco River on the line between lots 18 & 16 & 17 in the Third Division of Lands in Standish, thence South

west, across East thirty rods, thence South ninety degrees East One hundred & thirty rods, thence

South to the County Road in Standish, called the Laco Road

Voted to distribute the Surplus Revenue Money among the inhabitants of Standish, per Capitation

to the heads of families according to the Census of 1837

Voted to reconsider this vote - Then

Voted That the Surplus Revenue be divided among the inhabitants, per Capitation,

according to the Census of 1837, And that every head of a family, representing

the members thereof so far as to receive the sum accruing to each

Voted that the Committee, who loaned the money, received from the State Treasurer

be instructed to him, on the credit of the Town, the sum of Money necessary for

'distribution', as soon as practicable

Voted That the Town Treasurer, under the direction of the Committee, distribute

to him the sum of Money necessary for distribution, by the notes of said Treasurer,

which official paper city, have on the credit of the inhabitants of Standish, the

sum of Four thousand Dollars, to be paid as follows - (viz) One thousand on the

whole, sum remaining unpaid to be paid annually, and one thousand Dollars,

of the principal to be paid in one year, from the date of the notes, and the said

Dollars in two years, One thousand Dollars in three years (and the other thousand

Dollars in four years - Voted that the Committee distribute per cent interest for the Money

Voted That the Committee chosen on the eighteenth day of December last 1837, be

discharged from any further duties, relative to loaning & distributing money for said

Voted to adjourn this meeting until Monday next (March 12-1838) at an hour to be

Standish January 6th 1845- Pursuant to the within warrant I have notified the inhabitants of the town of Standish herein described to meet at the said time and place and for the purposes within mentioned - by posting up attested copies of this warrant in three public and conspicuous places in said town of Standish - seven days at least before the time of said meeting -
Ara Mayo. Constable of Standish -

Pursuant to the foregoing warrant the said inhabitants of the town of Standish met at the town house in said Standish on Monday the thirteenth day of January A.D. 1845 at one o'clock in the afternoon and voted as follows - viz -
1st That Ara Mayo. Moderator - who made oath for the faithful discharge of the duties incumbent on him as moderator before.

Mr. Mayes - Town Clerk -
The selectmen of the town then offered and submitted a report of which the following is a copy - viz -

" The subscribers, Selectmen of Standish upon the application of Greenham and eight others, to lay out a town road in said town - beginning at the mouth of the Parine road, so called, and ending at the County road near Steep Gull school house, passing over the same land and in the same place, where the County road passing over the high bridge, so called, and which has recently been discontinued by the County Commissioners - having given seven days written notice of our intention to lay out the same and stated in said notice the termini thereof, by posting up said notice in two public places in said town and in the vicinity of the proposed route on the 25th of Decr last - and having met at the time and place appointed for that purpose - and having personally examined the route proposed, are of opinion that there is occasion for a town road for the use of said town as proposed -

We, therefore, lay out said road as follows - Beginning at the mouth of the Parine road, so called, running north two degrees east - sixty nine rods - Thence north seven degrees east fifty six rods. Thence land of Elisha Street, thence north nine and one half degrees west one hundred and thirty rods. on Nathaniel Street's land - thence same course - seventy rods. over land of owner unknown - said road to be four rods wide - passing over the same land and in the same place that the County road did, which was recently discontinued by the County Commissioners - And we awarded to said Nathaniel Street twenty dollars - And Elisha Street ten dollars for their damages. to be paid by said town - And we allowed the several owners - exceptively - fifteen days - to take off the wood standing or growing on said land - And to remove the fence - which such laying out with the boundaries and admeasurements - we filed with the town clerk on the fourth day of January - 1845 - And we now hereby except such laying out with the boundaries and admeasurements of the same to said town at a meeting of the inhabitants - regularly warned and notified for them to accept and allow the same -
Given under our hands this fourth day of January - 1845 -

2^d Voted to accept the foregoing Report and to accept and allow road as located and laid out by the selectmen as appears by said report.

3^d Voted to build a bridge where the high bridge, so called, was laid road - and that the said bridge shall be made as good as the water course of Stone - The filling up to be with earth and Stone -

4th Voted to choose a Committee of three to superintend the making of said bridge -

5th Whose names were Joseph Sanborn and Pierce Sanborn said Committee.

6th Voted that said Committee shall notify a meeting at the said bridge to be holden on Monday next at ten o'clock in forenoon - when and where the said Committee shall confer for the making of said bridge by putting the same up at auction to the lowest bidder - And that the said bids shall be made to the acceptance of said Committee and shall be finished on or before the twentieth day of June next -

7th Voted to adjourn this meeting to the last Saturday of June next at one o'clock in the afternoon -
