CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chair Spencer and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING (S)

The minutes from the April 25 meeting were approved by unanimous consent.

PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

The Clerk said that she had not received any petitions or communications.

Councilor Olson followed-up on a inquiry as to the statue of the Economic Development Committee. She was please to announce that *Down East Magazine* recently ran an artide regarding village center zoning that cited the form-based code in the Town of Standish as being an innovative process to revitalize a village center.

Councilor Pomerleau noted that at the May Council meeting residents from Harmon's Beach Road bought forward their concerns regarding the condition of their road. He said that this Saturday approximately a mile of the road was paved. He said that he stopped at residents home on the road and they said that they are grateful of the improvements made to the road.

REPORT OF THE TOWN MANAGER

Diana Allen updated the Councilor on the Standish Summer Spectacular.
