<u>Art. 21.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following estimated General Fund EMPLOYEE BENEFITS expenditures for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 as recommended by the Municipal Officers:

<u>Art. 22.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following estimated General Fund INSURANCE expenditures for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 as recommended by the Municipal Officers:

<u>Art. 23.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following estimated General Fund DEBT SERVICE expenditures for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 as recommended by the Municipal Officers:

<u>Art. 24.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following estimated General Fund TRANSFERS OUT expenditures for the period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 as recommended by the Municipal Officers:

This is to fund the annual public safety fair. Funds are transferred out to the special revenue fund where this event is tracked consistent with prior practice.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$12,479 from unassigned fund balance to cover overdrafts in the following Town accounts for the Fiscal Year 2014/2015 as identified by the FY 15 Audit:

Building Maintenance \$140 Public Safety \$9,899 Public Works \$2,440

- 1.) The Building Maintenance department was overdrawn in the utilities line (CMP and PWD out of our control) and the contractual line (due to fire alarm panel replacement in main town office) of a \$6348 unexpected expense not budgeted. All the snow overran the OT budget for the building custodian as well.
- 2.) The Public Safety department was overdrawn in Intercepts, Fuels and Lubricants, Equipment Maintenance, Contractual and Medical Supplies. After conferring with the Fire Chief these are the explanations for the overage. The Intercepts were due to staffing issues throughout the year which has now been addressed through personnel committee for the FY17 budget. Fuels and Lubricants was over as heating was heavily taxed the 2014/2015 winter. Equipment and Maintenance was higher than expected because of the unexpected repair to the 2009 Rescue to the tune of \$14,000. Contractual contributed to the overdraft of the public safety budget due to painting and repairs to Steep Falls Fire Station that were above and beyond the estimated budget. Medical Supplies were higher than normal due to the elimination of O2 refilling station which by law does not allow us to refill oxygen tanks anymore. We went to a contracted service but the estimate was lower than actual since we did not know how much would be used.
- 3.) The Public Works department was overdrawn in Equipment Maintenance and Fuels and Lubricant. The heating of the new larger garage during an abnormally cold winter was one reason for Fuels being overdrawn. Repairs and Maintenance also had an unusually high number of repairs due to the heavy workload of the harsh winter. One of the trucks had a transmission issue during peak plow season. More hours of work on the machinery means more breakdowns. Street lights were higher than anticipated this past year as well which is out of our control.
- <u>Art. 26.</u> To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$350,000 from UNASSIGNED FUND BALANCE ("Surplus") of the Town for the purpose of reducing the property tax commitment in the 2017 fiscal year as recommended by the Municipal Officers.
- <u>Art. 27.</u> To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Council to accept and expend, on behalf of the Town, federal, state or private funds received in the form of grants or gifts during the period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

<u>Art. 28.</u> To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Council to expend such sums of money as it deems necessary from the impact fee reserve account for their designated purpose during the period from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 as recommended by the municipal officers.

<u>Art 29.</u> To see if the town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit to \$2,863,288 established for the Town of Standish by State law in the event that the municipal budget approved under the preceding articles will result in a tax commitment that is greater than that property tax levy limit.

[If necessary to be voted on, State law requires that Article 28 be voted on by paper ballot.]

<u>Art. 30.</u> To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,857,396 by property taxation towards the 2016/2017 annual budget as recommended by the municipal officers.

The Registrar of Voters will hold office hours while the meeting is in session to correct an error or change a name or address on the voting list; to accept the registration of any person eligible to vote; and to accept new enrollments.

A person who is not registered may not vote at the annual town meeting.
